

### Worst NHS Crisis in a Generation

- Winter pressures have combined with longstanding problems in adult social care, hospitals and primary care
- The elective waiting list over 7 million
- Bed occupancy is above 95%.
- Waits at A&E and for ambulances reached record levels in December, but are still substantially worse than pre-pandemic.
- Failure in the health and care system are estimated to be contributing to hundreds of preventable deaths a week.

### Access Difficult for Patients

- Half of Patients found it difficult or very difficult getting a GP appointment.
- 4 in 10 said they were only offered a telephone consultation when they wanted to see a doctor face to face.
- 23% said they were unable to get a GP appointment the last time they tried
- Ambulances, A&E, Delayed Discharges similar challenges

#### Mental Health Pressures

- 16% increase in people using mental health services
- 30% increase in use in under 18s
- Four times as many people are waiting more than 12 hours in A&E before accessing mental health services cf 2 years ago

# Why is the NHS under so much Pressure?

- Demographics
- Resources
- Workforce Shortages
- Adult Social Care Inadequacies
- Health Inequalities
- Very Little Headroom

#### Little Headroom-King's Fund

Pre pandemic the NHS was a <u>lean service</u>, with a low length of stay in hospital and a high occupancy rate

COVID-19 emergency admissions put pressures on beds

Planned treatments cancelled and patients' conditions deteriorate

This led to pressure on primary care, NHS 111 and ambulance services

Patients who would have received planned care end up being seen in emergency settings instead.

Hospitals finding it difficult to discharge patients owing to pressures on adult social care and backlogs in community care

Lack of free beds so ambulance crews find it more difficult to handover patients

#### Health and Care Bill

#### Hospital food standards

- Impose requirements in connection with food or drink provided or made available to any person on hospital premises in England......
- Regulations may (a) specify nutritional standards, or other nutritional requirements, which are to be complied with; (b) require that specified descriptions of food or drink are not to be provided or made available......
